Driving Tips to Keep You and Your Passengers Safe:

- Allow yourself enough time to reach your destination
- Keep a safe distance behind the vehicle in front of you
- Stay aware of your surroundings
- Check the weather before you travel
- Bring snacks and water
- Don't let your vehicle get low on gas
- Check your vehicle's tires, fluid levels, and other maintenance items
- Don't drive while sleepy
- Take plenty of rest breaks
- Know your route and be aware of construction zones that may cause delays

Vehicles, Pedestrians, and Roundabouts OH MY!

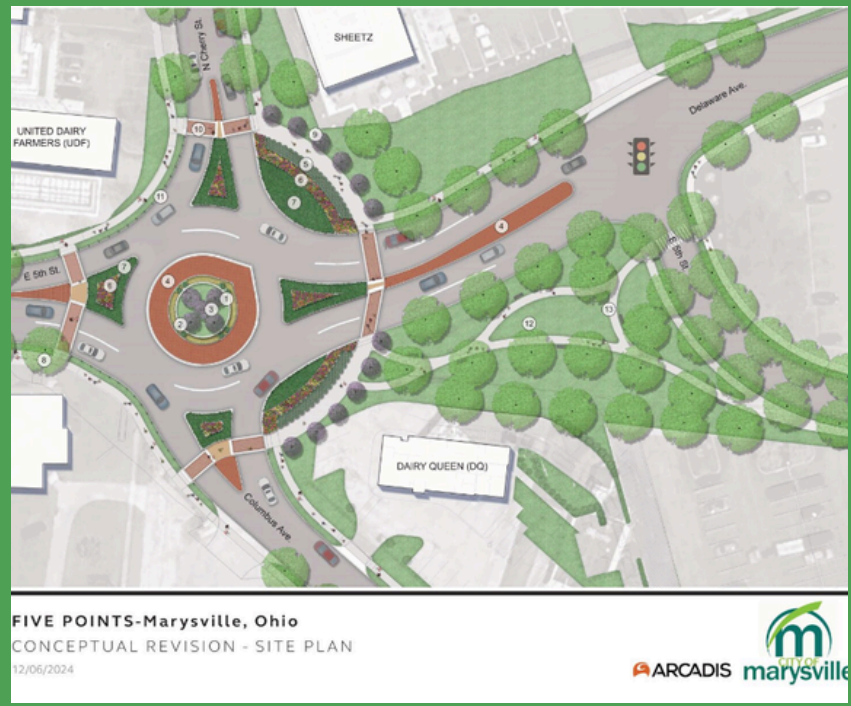
Union County residents generally have mixed opinions when it comes to roundabouts. Initial concerns individuals may have are not knowing how to navigate a roundabout or that roundabouts increase traffic accidents. After drivers are comfortable learning roundabout dos and don'ts, it then becomes a positive experience for drivers.

You may be wondering how much safer a roundabout really makes an intersection. According to Union County Daily Digital, roundabouts decrease crashes by 48% and serious injury accidents and death by 80% compared to intersections with light signals.

In the next few years, Marysville will be adding a number of roundabouts to simplify navigation, improve traffic flow, and enhance safety. Placing a roundabout at 5 Points seems to be a topic of conversation within the community (see conceptual site plan below). This project is currently planned to break ground sometime in 2027.

Additional roundabouts are in the plans for Union County, including the intersection of Coleman's Crossing and Industrial Parkway, the intersection of SR 347 and SR 4, and the intersection of SR 347 and SR 31. These are just three of the roundabout projects being planned. There are more roundabouts being planned for Union County to promote safe traffic areas for drivers and pedestrians. How does it work?

The Mary-Go-Round runs every Thursday from 10am-3pm with scheduled stops to Meijer, Walmart, and Kroger. The Mary-Go-Round is open to all area riders who are age 50+. The shuttle will pick-up and drop-off riders at each of the stops along the loop. Riders may take the shuttle coming, going, or round trip to and from their destinations.

Can I request to be dropped off at a location not listed on the route?

At this time, the Mary-Go-Round will accommodate alternative stops that are along or near to the original route. You must speak to the driver to confirm your request.

How many bags or parcels can I bring on the shuttle?

There is no limit on the amount of bags or parcels brought the shuttle. When riding, please be mindful of other riders and keep bags clear of any walkways on the shuttle.

What is the cost?

Riders may ride the shuttle for free.

The Mary-Go-Round is a collaboration between Neighbor to Neighbor, Bridges Community Action, A Way Out LLC, and the Age-Friendly Innovation Center at The Ohio State University College of Social Work.

- Rides to and from 43040 are eligible for UC vouchers.
- Incentive provided for workforce transportation from 43040 to the Honda Campus.
- Discount opportunities are limited, and incentives may vary.
- Rider responsible for costs in excess of voucher amount, tips, and cancellation/no-show fees.

EMERGENCY RIDE HOME PROGRAM



The MORPC Emergency Ride Home (ERH) program is a free service that assures commuters taking alternative modes of transportation to and from work won't be stranded in the case of an emergency, illness, or unexpected overtime. It's a foolproof benefit meant to ease the minds of commuters who carpool or vanpool, bike, or take the bus to work and need to get home quickly.

The program is now allowing registered users to take their emergency rides with the licensed rideshare provider of their choice (Uber, Lyft, or a taxi provider). Users will pay for the ride up front and be reimbursed via a mailed check within 4 weeks after uploading their receipt on gohiocommute.com/morpc.

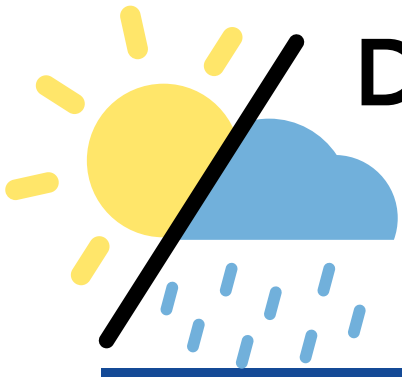
