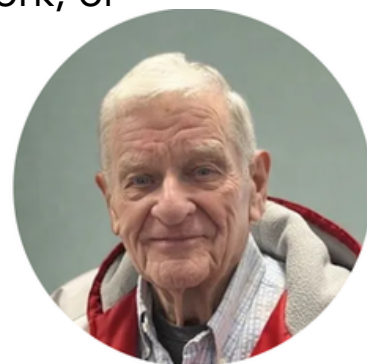
Why We Do What We Do

Helping Mature Drivers Find Their Safest Fit



CarFit is a free, educational program designed to help drivers improve the "fit" of their vehicles for comfort and safety.

A FREE 20-minute, 1-on-1 check-up with a Trained CarFit Technician will help you better understand:

- Proper safety belt use and fit
- Safe distance between you and your airbag
- Clear line of sight above the steering wheel
- Mirror positioning to minimize blind spots
- State and local resources

Road Work Updates:

US 42/Industrial Parkway



US 42 / Industrial Parkway intersection work is set to begin the week of September 8th. This construction project is designed to upgrade the intersection to make it safer. The initial project will start with 42 to widen it to five lanes and a new signal light. Work on the Industrial Parkway portion will begin in the Spring. Anyone travelling Southbound will be detoured during this last phase. The project is planned to be completed by June 2026.

To ensure you are driving or riding safely, give yourself plenty of time to reach your destination and plan accordingly.

How does it work?

The Mary-Go-Round runs every Thursday from 10am-3pm with scheduled stops to Meijer, Walmart, and Kroger. The Mary-Go-Round is open to all area riders who are age 50+. The shuttle will pick up and drop off riders at each of the stops along the loop. Riders may take the shuttle coming, going, or round-trip to and from their destinations.

Can I request to be dropped off at a location not listed on the route?

At this time, the Mary-Go-Round will accommodate alternative stops that are along or near to the original route. You must speak to the driver to confirm your request.

How many bags or parcels can I bring on the shuttle?

There is no limit on the number of bags or parcels brought on the shuttle. When riding, please be mindful of other riders and keep bags clear of any walkways on the shuttle.

What is the cost?

Riders may ride the shuttle for free.

The Mary-Go-Round is a collaboration between Neighbor to Neighbor, Bridges Community Action, A Way Out LLC, and the Age-Friendly Innovation Center at The Ohio State University College of Social Work.

EMERGENCY RIDE HOME PROGRAM



The MORPC Emergency Ride Home (ERH) program is a free service that assures commuters taking alternative modes of transportation to and from work won't be stranded in the case of an emergency, illness, or unexpected overtime. It's a foolproof benefit meant to ease the minds of commuters who carpool or vanpool, bike, or take the bus to work, and need to get home quickly.

The program is now allowing registered users to take their emergency rides with the licensed rideshare provider of their choice (Uber, Lyft, or a taxi provider). Users will pay for the ride up front and be reimbursed via a mailed check within 4 weeks after uploading their receipt on gohiocommute.com/morpc.

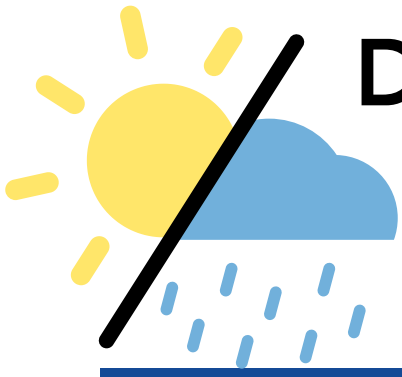
